Preliminary Notice of Annual General Meeting of the Nepean / Blue Mountains Prostate Cancer Support Group

All members are advised that the Annual General Meeting is due to be held on Monday 21st November 2022 commencing at 7.00pm. (You will note this is one month later than our usual October date.)

Due in part to the impact of Covid, the Group is really struggling to remain relevant. Attendance at our re instigated Monthly meetings has been relatively poor. (We have re established our contact with local media outlets, hopefully this will help us to spread the message.)

But, we really need some 'new blood' in the running of the Group. Many of the Board members have been involved for a number of years. (*Personally, I have been involved for nearly 20 years! I've gone stale.*)

At least two of the current Board Members have advised that they will not be standing for re election this year.

If we cannot get more interest from members to become involved and join the Board we will not be able to continue to function.

We have operated in the past with the bare minimum of numbers.

The purpose of the Group is to generate awareness and provide support for men (and their partners) who have received a positive diagnosis of Prostate Cancer.

Breaking news from our PCFA!

PCFA is pleased to announce that Australia's Pharmaceutical Benefits Advisory Committee has just recommended the listing of Erlyand® (apalutamide) on the PBS for men with high-risk prostate cancers that are still responsive to hormone therapy (known as metastatic hormone-sensitive prostate cancers).

This is the major first step toward convincing the new Health Minister to get this life-extending precision medicine listed. If we're successful, eligible men and families will save around \$40,000 a year in prescription costs.

This outcome follows a lengthy advocacy campaign by PCFA, with thousands of men likely to benefit over time.

Thank you to all those of you who supported our submission on this!

We'll keep up our work to expand access to Erlyand® and other life-extending medications.

Prostate Cancer in Australia

Key Statistics - Report issued by PCFA

July 2022

Key statistics

• Prostate cancer is the most commonly diagnosed cancer in Australia and the most commonly diagnosed cancer among Australian men.

• 24,217 Australian men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer in 2022. • 3,507 Australian men will die from prostate cancer in 2022.

• 66 Australian men are diagnosed each day with prostate cancer, and about 10 Australian men will die each day from the disease.

• 240,245 Australian men are alive today after a diagnosis of prostate cancer between 1982 and 2017.

• Men diagnosed with prostate cancer have a 95% chance of surviving for five years compared to their counterparts in the general Australian population.

• Between 1987–1991 and 2014–2018, five-year relative survival for prostate cancer improved from 60% to 95%.

• In 2018, 21,853 Australian men were diagnosed with prostate cancer.

• In 2020, there were 3,568 deaths from prostate cancer in Australia.

Detailed data

• Prostate cancer is the 2nd most common cause of death from cancer in Australian men.

• Prostate cancer will cause an estimated 12% of all male deaths from cancer in Australia in 2020.

• The estimated risk of a man being diagnosed with prostate cancer by age 85 is 1 in 5.

• The estimated risk of a man dying from prostate cancer by his 85th birthday is 1 in 23.

• The rate of men dying from prostate cancer in Australia has been gradually falling over the past 20 years.

• Men living in regional or rural areas of Australia have approximately 24% higher rate of dying from prostate cancer than their urban counterparts.

• Indigenous men with prostate cancer have an estimated 86% chance of survival by 5 years after diagnosis, which is lower than the national average.

A message from Steve Callister (National Chairman of PCFA)

September is "Prostate Cancer Awareness Month" and PCFA is once again organising <u>The Long</u> <u>Run</u>, to help make prostate cancer history.

Thanks to your support, we have grown our impact in the past year to reach 2 in 3 Australian men who are newly diagnosed with prostate cancer, while continuing our strong support for more than 240,000 men who have been diagnosed with the disease at some point in their lives.

We have launched a new Telenursing Service and Counselling Service, expanded our hospital-based Specialist Nursing Service, grown the Support Group Network, and strengthened our collaborations with government, health service providers, industry, and the community.

Our advocacy has been strong, culminating in a recent decision by the RACGP to update its Red Book guidance on PSA testing and securing the Government's support for a review of the Clinical Guidelines for PSA Testing.

We have also redoubled our focus on driving the very latest research, funding the EVOLUTION Phase II Clinical Trial and establishing a broadly-based Prostate Cancer Future Fund to create pathways for eliminating avoidable deaths in our lifetime and transforming care for men and their families, maintaining an unrelenting focus on long-term survivorship and quality of life.


A flight attendant was stationed at the departure gate to check tickets.
